If you know a young person looking for a summer job, tell them about the Canada Summer Jobs Bank and encourage them to apply.

Our recent budget builds off our work to help make life more affordable for Canadians, strengthening our universal public health care system, and building a clean economy that will create good jobs. We've introduced a new Grocery Rebate to help 11 million Canadians who need it most, are working towards \$10-a-day childcare, and expanding the Canada Dental Benefit.

Jobs and the Economy

I proudly attended the most significant auto investment in our nation's history. Canada is bringing the first overseas Volkswagen electric vehicle battery manufacturing plant in North America to St. Thomas. This investment signals a strong vote of confidence in Canada and our region's highly skilled workers, strong economy, and business environments.

This major investment will create 3,000 direct and 30,000 indirect jobs and will be the largest manufacturing plant in Canada. The plant will have six production lines and produce batteries for up to one million electric vehicles annually.

Whether it is supporting our local small businesses, entrepreneurs, or those entering the workforce for the first time, we will continue investing in those growing our economy.





Grocery Rebate

Our government remains working hard to make life more affordable for you.

To help offset rising living expenses, the Government of Canada has introduced a one-time **Grocery Rebate** for 11 million low- and modest-income Canadians and families who need it most.

Introduced in Budget 2023, the new one-time Grocery Rebate will deliver targeted inflation relief and will be delivered to eligible Canadians starting July 5, 2023.

Eligible couples with two children could receive up to an extra \$467 for; up to an extra \$234 for single Canadians without children; and an extra \$225 for seniors, on average.

As we move forward together during these challenging times, we'll continue to implement measures to ensure families receive much-needed support.
