

Ottawa Update

Heritage Committee



As a member of the Heritage Committee, I have been working on issues regarding Hockey Canada. Canadians have lost trust in Hockey Canada, and parents want to ensure their children are safe.

Our government has imposed conditions on Hockey Canada, including suspending federal funding to their organization and enacting a financial audit to ensure no public funds were used in settlement cases.

Recent events, and testimony I've heard in Ottawa, show that Hockey Canada failed to address systemic abuse within its organization and must do more to regain Canadians' trust.

I will continue to work hard to ensure our children can safely participate in sports.

Agriculture Committee

At the Agriculture Committee, my colleagues and I completed a study on global food insecurity with a focus on the crisis in Ukraine. We heard from Ukrainian Parliamentarians, The Minister of Agrarian

Policy and Food of Ukraine, representatives from the Food and Agriculture Organization of the United

Nations, among others. We studied how the food crisis caused by the illegal invasion is not only affecting those currently in Ukraine but many other parts of the world. Our committee has made recommendations to the Government and the Minister of Agriculture that will help support Ukraine and help mitigate the global food crisis.

I had the pleasure of meeting Jean Wright, a resident of Morningside Retirement Community in New

Hamburg. Jean carried the torch during the opening ceremonies of Morningside's Summer Games. When I saw Jean, 93 years young, confidently carrying the Summer Game's torch through the cheering crowd of her peers, I knew there was a story to tell.

Jean arrived in Waterloo 52 years ago, with the local theatre scene calling her name. Before coming to Canada, she frequented nightclubs as a singer and dancer in London, England and was a part of a travelling rumba band during the war. After moving to Canada, Jean switched to acting and has been in dozens of plays and musicals – so many that she can't even count! Jean is no longer involved in theatre; however, her talents are still sought after, with Drayton Entertainment asking her to be involved in a play this summer.

Jean mentions the most challenging role she has ever played was when she played Mother Courage and had to pull a Conestoga wagon around the stage – which made carrying the torch at the Morningside Summer Games a piece of cake.
