

As we take a moment to pause and reflect on the past year, I find myself humbled and inspired by the many heartfelt conversations I've had with incredible individuals like you throughout our community.

In every exchange—whether with families, local businesses, farmers, or our invaluable community organizations—I always notice a powerful common thread: our resilience and unwavering community spirit. It's this strength that defines Kitchener-Conestoga and fuels my immense pride in representing your voices in Ottawa.

I understand this past year has been challenging for many. In these trying times, I want to assure you that our government remains committed to providing the support Canadians need.

We're actively combating our biggest housing challenges with innovative approaches, like compiling pre-approved designs to build homes faster and more cost-effectively across the country. This strategy helped Canada quickly and affordably build thousands of homes after the Second World War, and now we're bringing it into the 21st century to change the way Canada builds homes. Through our government's Housing Accelerator Fund (HAF), we are providing \$42 million to build 1,200 housing units in Kitchener over the next three years.

The new Canada Dental Care Plan will help up to nine million eligible Canadians get the dental care they need.

In 2023, we implemented a 9-8-8 Suicide Crisis Helpline which provides callers with specialized support from an experienced network of partners whose trained responders provide help and compassion without judgment.

These are just a few of the ways our government is working for Canadians every single day.

My office is here to serve you. Whether I'm representing you in Ottawa or standing shoulder to shoulder with you in our community, know that I remain committed to being your unwavering representative. Your feedback and conversations are my guiding light, motivating me to work tirelessly on behalf of each and every one of you.



2023 Investments In Our Community

Part of my important work in Ottawa includes securing funding projects that will benefit our community. Meaningful conversations with constituents and businesses helps determine where funding can be most impactful. I continue to work tirelessly to ensure that federal government investments are directed towards Kitchener-Conestoga. Here are some examples:

Children, Families and Seniors

In Kitchener-Conestoga, our federal government is supporting the vital service organizations in our communities with \$900,000 of funding to groups including Elmira District Community Living, Interfaith Counselling Centre, Wilmot Family Resource Centre, Community Care Concepts, Community Support Connections, and Woolwich Community Health Centre.

Agriculture

Farmers feed families; as a member of the Agriculture Committee I am proud to support them. Federal financial support is helping to build a resilient agriculture sector for generations to come. In 2023, our government helped farmers in Kitchener-Conestoga with \$1.2 million in funding to install solar panels as part of the Agricultural Clean Technology Program.

Canada Child Benefit

The Canada Child Benefit provides 6,300 families in Kitchener-Conestoga with an average of \$6,000 per year. This year, our federal government continued to put families first by increasing the amount of the Canada Child Benefit.

Small Businesses

In 2023, the federal government invested \$2.5 million in Kitchener-Conestoga's businesses. Small businesses are the backbone of our economy and supporting them is an investment in our community.

Canada Summer Jobs

In 2023, the Canada Summer Jobs Program supported 57 employers from the not-for-profit, public, and private sectors in Kitchener-Conestoga with \$700,000 in funding to create 190 jobs. Investing in youth gives them the skills and experience they need to succeed in the workforce.

Municipalities and Infrastructure

In 2023, over \$42 million in investments and supports was delivered to the municipalities of Kitchener-Conestoga. In addition, our government's investment of \$20 million in our regional airport has been crucial for facilitating efficient transportation, connecting businesses and residents to broader markets, and fostering economic prosperity in our region.

Our government has invested over 2 million dollars in Kitchener-Conestoga's Arts and Tourism sector to organizations like Drayton Entertainment, St. Jacobs Farmers' Market, Neruda Arts, and Wilmot Heritage Fire Brigades Museum. Beyond providing entertainment, these organizations contribute significantly to jobs and revenue creation, and the overall vitality of communities.

Broadband Internet

Our Universal Broadband Fund will ensure that 98% of Canadians are connected by 2026. The federal government has invested over \$18 million in Kitchener-Conestoga, including \$7 million in Wellesley in 2023 to respond to the needs of our


